mixed waste. Leave your Christmas
tree near the waste container.

You can also take your Christmas
tree to a Sortti Station. We receive
individual Christmas tree free of
charge during January.

Tips and ideas for waste-free
Christmas presents (in Finnish):

- » **Fried ham fat** in a container with a tight-fitting lid into the mixed waste or solidified into biowaste. Do not pour fat into drains or flush down the toilet because it can block the pipes.
- » **Food waste** into biowaste, not down the toilet.
- » **Gift papers** and ribbons into mixed waste. They are not suitable for wastepaper or carton collection.
- » **Aluminium foil** bakeware and pans, tin foil and metal cups for tea lights into metal collection
- » **Broken LED** candles and string lights into waste electric and electronic equipment collection. Check out the nearest recycling point:

- » **New Year's tin** into hazardous waste collection because they contain a lot of lead. Take your New Year's tin, free of charge, to HSY's hazardous waste container or to a Sortti Station.
